WITH FOCUS ON INTEGRATION OF REFUGEES

August 27th – September 2nd 2023 Prague, Faculty of Science, Charles University

Geographic Migration Centre – GEOMIGRACE <u>www.geomigrace.cz</u>, a research institute affiliated with the Department of Social Geography and Regional Development, <u>Faculty of Science, Charles University</u> and <u>IOM International Organization for Migration in Prague</u> cordially invites students and young professionals to Prague, for the Summer School on Migration, The <u>United Nations Information Centre Prague UNIC</u> is partner of the 2023 program.

The one-week course will be organized at the Faculty of Science, <u>Charles University</u>, in the heart of the capital city, Prague (Albertov 6). Founded in 1348, Charles University is one of the oldest universities in Europe and ranks among the world's most renowned research-focused universities.

Experienced and respected scholars and practitioners (from IOM and other international and non-governmental organizations) from various countries will take part in the Summer School while delivering lectures and/or leading seminars, workshops, panel discussions on issues closely related to migration. It will be examined from political, sociocultural, demographic, development, gender and other perspectives.

This year's event will focus on the integration of persons with international (temporary) protection.

Similar to previous years we expect as many as 80 - 100 university students and professionals from many countries worldwide (literally, from all the continents). The selection of participants, speakers and the organization of the summer school will be in line with the principles of diversity.

The summer school will be physically held in Prague, if necessary, a hybrid/online program will be announced and arranged in advance.

In addition to the academic part, other accompanying events, especially cultural ones, will take place. The program will follow a similar format as last years, see http://geomigrace.cz/en/news/
