The course will be organized physically at the <u>Charles University</u>, one of the oldest European universities founded in 1348. Experienced and respected scholars and practitioners will take part in the Summer School while delivering lectures and/or leading seminars, workshops, panel discussions on issues closely related to migration. It will be examined from political, economic, sociocultural, demographic, development, geographical and perspectives.

This year's event will focus on the integration of persons with international (temporary) protection.

In addition to the academic part, other accompanying events, especially cultural ones, will take place.
